

Manuscript Preparation:

1) Cover page file which includes the following:

The title of the article, the title should reflect the content of the article. Be specific, not general. If relevant, mention the study period and location, the international scientific name of the studied organism or the experimental design (e.g. case study or randomized controlled trial).

Authors' names, affiliations of all authors, and email address of the corresponding author.

2) Manuscript file: It includes the abstract with the keywords; main body of article followed by the reference list. This is the file which goes to peer-reviewers, so please ensure it does not reveal your names or affiliations.

- All details about authors such as their names, affiliations, email addresses, author contributions, fund statement, etc. must be included in a title page. If such information were mentioned in the manuscript body, the manuscript will be returned to authors.
- References should be listed numerically at the end of the article in their order of appearance. The references must be given in the Vancouver style. Authors are advised to study thoroughly the following: International Committee of Medical Journal Editors: Uniform requirements of manuscripts submitted to biomedical journal Br. Med. J. 1982; 284: 1766-70.
- The manuscript should contain continuous line numbering and pages should be numbered starting with the title page using Arabic numerals. Use double spacing and start each section in a new page (Title, Introduction, Methods, Result, etc.). The S.I. units of measurements are preferred. Authors are advised to assemble, analyze and present their data according to: Altman DG et al. Statistical guidelines for contributors to medical journals. Br. Med. J. 1983; 286: 1489-1493.

3) Appendix files: Tables, figures and image files should be clearly labelled. You can submit separate files for figures, images and tables or have them combined in one file. The location of tables and figures should be indicated in the body of article. Tables are needed in a text mode, not as images (create tables using the Word processing software). If you are a Macintosh user, you must also type the extension at the end of the file name you choose. All illustrations should be numbered and have clear relevant captions. Figures should be of a high quality. Colour figures are welcomed.

4) Articles accepted for publication are subject to editorial revision. Revised manuscripts submitted should contain track changes highlighting the revisions made and response to reviewers are also required. Revisions not containing track changes and response to reviewers will be sent back to authors.
